

#### Internet users as a percentage of total population








# Robot Density 2013-2022. World Average







The 2023 Edelman Trust Barometer found that six countries are now considered to be "severely polarized". The state of divisiveness in Argentina is commonly known as la grieta, or the rift.






#### Global Poverty Trends, 2019-2023

... in times of instability and uncertainty, universities are being seen as trying to refrain or to avoid disruption as much as possible




#### A paradox

...but they have a tendency to inhibit their innovation capacity



Demonstrates leadership for engagement at all organizational levels




Involves communities in continuous, purposeful, and authentic ways, with a deliberate approach to partnerships.

Demonstrates a core commitment to learning through engagement endeavors.

Develops and sustains necessary policies and infrastructure Links engagement to every dimension of campus life and decisions



#### PLACE-BASED EDUCATION

#### DEFINITION

Place-based education (PBE) is an environmentally and culturally conscious approach to education that uses the local environment and community as a context for learning. It is designed to provide students with the chance to exercise citizenship and agency, and build connections in their community.

#### **KEY FEATURES**

- Active project-based learning
- Engagement with local issues
- A focus on natural environments and sustainability
- Emphasis on heritage and culture
- Embraces community service and local citizenship education
