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# Overview

The **7<sup>th</sup> Edition of the MENA Higher Education Leadership Forum (MENA-HELP)** will be held in the vibrant city of **Dubai, United Arab Emirates, from April 14–16, 2026**. Taking place under the timely theme **“Global Challenges, Local Impact: Higher Education’s Role in Shaping a Resilient Future,”** this edition comes at a defining moment for the global higher education sector.

Launched in 2013 as a biennial gathering, MENA-HELP has grown into one of the most prominent international platforms dedicated to higher education leadership.
