# Overview

The **7<sup>th</sup> Edition of the MENA Higher Education Leadership Forum (MENA-HELF)** will be held in the vibrant city of **Dubai, United Arab Emirates, from September 28–30, 2026**. Taking place under the timely theme **“Global Challenges, Local Impact: Higher Education’s Role in Shaping a Resilient Future,”** this edition comes at a defining moment for the global higher education sector.

Launched in 2013 as a biennial gathering, MENA-HELF has grown into one of the most prominent international platforms dedicated to higher education leadership. With participation from over 60 countries in previous editions, the Forum provides a truly global and cross-regional space for dialogue, critical reflection, strategic collaboration, and the exchange of best practices.
